# From Imposter to Impressor: Embracing Complex Identities in STFM

### André Isaacs (He/Him)

Associate Professor of Chemistry College of the Holy Cross

A native of Jamaica, André received his B.A. in Chemistry from the College of the Holy Cross in 2005. He received his PhD from the University of Pennsylvania in 2011 and then worked as a post-doctoral researcher with Professor Richmond Sarpong at the University of California, Berkeley. In 2012, André accepted a tenure-track position at his alma mater, the College of the Holy Cross. In 2018, André was promoted to the rank of Associate Professor with tenure. In addition to teaching courses in Organic Chemistry, André conducts research utilizing copper-mediated organic transformations. He is one of the founding members and former cochair of Outfront - the college's LGBTQ faculty and staff alliance. He uses his social media platform to challenge and dismantle the normative culture in STEM and to increase visibility of queer and BIPOC folks.

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#### **ABOUT THE INCLUSION WORKSHOP SERIES**



The Knight Campus Graduate Internship Program (KCGIP) Inclusion Symposium is the capstone of the accelerated master's program's Inclusion Workshop Series.
